The Volcanic Legacy Scenic Byway All-American Road winds 500 miles between Lake Almanor in California and Crater Lake, Oregon. It is one of 32 All-American Roads in the U.S. and showcases the spectacular volcanic landscapes, and natural and cultural resources, that can only be seen in this part of America.

The VLCP’s mission is to partner with communities, tourism organizations, tribes and agencies to promote and develop the byway through various interpretive media. The VLCP Board of Directors is also involved in implementing byway-related projects that enhance tourism and the quality of life of byway communities, such as trail development. “Our collaborative efforts to promote the byway have a positive economic impact on the rural communities along this scenic drive,” said Norton. “We really appreciate the assistance of all our partners.”
